Special Services this Month Palm Sunday March 24th at 10:30 AM

Once again Delores the Christian Donkey will be with us to celebrate Palm Sunday, on March 24. She will be visiting the Sunday School classes, then be a part of our worship service at 10:30, and she will be a part of Children's Church that day. Afterwards, everyone is invited to visit with Delores.

Maundy Thursday March 28th at 7PM

This is a special service where we commemorate the Last Supper of Jesus and his disciples in the upper room. As part of this service everyone participates in the last supper, in a recreation of the upper room.

Good Friday March 29th at Noon

This is a Tenebrae Service, which is one of the oldest traditions in the Christian Church. Through Scripture readings and hymns, the story of Christ's betrayal, trial, and crucifixion is told. As the Passion story unfolds, candles are extinguished, and the darkness deepens, until with the death of Christ, only one light is left burning. This light is removed from the sanctuary, symbolizing Christ's three days in the tomb.

Easter Sunrise Service March 31st at 7:00 AM On top of Big Pocono, Lot #2 (Camelback Mountain)

In this service, we remember how the women disciples of Christ came to the tomb early in morning to find it empty and that Jesus Christ had risen!





"He said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead." Luke 16:31 (The conclusion of Jesus' parable of The Rich Man and Lazarus in Luke 16:19-31).

The well-known and highly respected academic and management consultant reviewed the data his team had collected. There was no doubt about it, the very simple change of modifying the lighting in the production area, the productivity of the workers had a sharp increase. He thought to himself, let us try to lower the light and see what effect it has. They did so and were surprised when the productivity still increased. Not understanding what was going on, they returned the lighting to where had been prior to the experiment, and took a few weeks to analyze the data. During those few weeks the productivity of the workers dropped. The consultant team returned and made no changes to the lighting, but once again there was an increase in production. The conclusion became that when workers knew they were being watched their behavior changed, which became known as the Hawthorne effect, named after the Western Electric Plant where the study was conducted from 1928 – 1932. It is almost taken for granted that when someone whose opinion matters to you in some way, enters a room, our behavior will change. Being conscious of the person in the room, will cause restrain of conversations or actions, or encourage other actions to make an impression on that person. Are we conscious of God being in the room? Do we love God so much, that we know God is real and not just an abstraction? We are called "to try to find out what is pleasing to the Lord" (Ephesians 5:10). After we have accepted Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior, we are, to quote Jesus, "born from above" (John 3:3). Are we conscious of Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior? How much is God just a feel good abstraction. Our self-identification as a Christian, does not mean that we are conscious of the resurrected Christ. The rich man in Jesus' parable about the "Rich man and Lazarus" (Luke 16:19-31), believed that he was part of God's chosen people. He knew about Moses and all the prophets, but God was just an abstraction to him, like a voter-registration card making him a member of a political party. As you can read, it did not end well for him. Dietrich Bonhoeffer, observed a absence of God being real and of Christ just being abstraction in the Christian churches of late 1930's Germany. In the end, as history attests, the German church morphed into the Reich Church, that replaced Jesus Christ, with Adolf Hitler. How is that we see ourselves? Do we consider ourselves Christians, just because we are a part of Reeders? Is the one whom we celebrate in song and praises this Easter, real to us, or is he just a comfortable abstraction?

When we attempt to Christianity without a moment-by-moment conscious awareness of Christ and following Him, we have an illusion. For "not everyone who says to" Jesus "'Lord, Lord' will enter the Kingdom of Heaven, but only the one who does the will of the Father in heaven" (Matthew 7:21). During this remaining time of Lent, may you draw closer to Jesus Christ, and be conscious of His Holy Spirit in your life. May Jesus become real to you, so that you to follow Him every moment of every day.
